MINUTES OF THE THIRTY-THIRD MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT HELD ON 16 SEPTEMBER 2019 AT 14:00 HRS AT THE CONFERENCE ROOM

The Thirty-Third meeting of the Board of Management was held on 16 September 2019 at 14:00 hours at the Conference Room.

Dr Ashok Khosla, Dr Alok Adholeya, Mr Ishteyaque Amjad, and Ms Anita Arjundas were unable to attend the meeting.

Vice Chancellor welcomed the members at the Thirty third Board of Management Meeting. He informed the Board that the Director General, TERI had been invited as a permanent invitee to the Board of Management of TERI SAS and he welcomed Mr Amit Kumar who was representing the DG in the meeting.

- ITEM NO.1: To confirm the minutes of the Thirty Second meeting of the Board of Management held on 06 June 2019. The Registrar informed that the minutes of the Thirty Second meeting of the Board of Management held on 06 June 2019 were circulated to the members of the Board. He presented the comments received from members for review. While approving the circulated draft minutes the members suggested the following: -
 - (a) Though a class and cap for travel budget has been suggested in the resolution passed by the Board for VC's travel expenses, the VC might still exercise his/her discretion to travel in economy class depending on the financial situation of the University.
 - (b) A committee may be formed to evolve a road map consolidating TERI SAS actions wrt going carbon neutral by 2050 and the same be communicated to everybody.
- **TS/BM/33.1.1.** The Board resolved that the minutes of the 32nd meeting of BoM held on 06 June 2019 at the conference room, as circulated be and is hereby confirmed and noted.

MATTERS FOR INFORMATION

ITEM No.2(a). Appointment of Acting Vice Chancellor. The Registrar informed that consequent to the acceptance of the resignation of Dr Leena Srivastava; the Chancellor had appointed Dr Manipadma Datta, Professor, Department of Business and Sustainability as the Vice Chancellor (Acting), TERI SAS with effect from 09 July 2019.

The Board noted the matter.

ITEM No.2(b). Constitution of Search cum Selection committee for appointment of a new **Vice Chancellor.** The Registrar informed that the Chancellor had appointed the Search cum Selection Committee on 26th Aug 2019 and the Committee has been requested to submit its recommendations within a period of three months. The Registrar stated that The Search cum Selection Committee (SCSC) met on 13 Sept 2019 at TERI SAS and deliberated on the process to be followed for the selection and recommended for inviting applications through advertisement in the national daily.

The Board noted the matter.

ITEM No.2(c). SIRO recognition for TERI SAS. The Registrar informed that based on the application submitted by the University to Department of Scientific and Industrial Research (DSIR) for recognition of TERI SAS as Scientific & Industrial Research Organization (SIRO), the DSIR had approved the recognition on 23 July 2019 till 31 March 2022. He stated that this recognition would help the University in obtaining customs duty exemption for scientific instruments and will also help in enriching Scientific & Industrial Research accomplishments.

The Board noted the matter.

ITEM No.2(d). Appointment of Trustees. The Registrar informed that DG TERI through his e-mail dated 03 Sep 2019 had intimated that Dr Prodipto Ghosh and Dr Syamal Kumar Sarkar had been appointed by the Governing Council of TERI as the additional Trustees of the TERI SAS Trust. The Registrar informed that the Trust Board would now consist of five trustees.

The Board noted the matter.

ITEM No.2(e). Appeal to NAAC for re consideration of Grade: The Registrar informed that NAAC had reviewed the appeal filed by TERI SAS for reconsideration of the grade conveyed in November 2018 and retained the original score of 2.84 at "B++" Grade valid for a period of five years from May 1, 2019. He stated that the issue was discussed in the Academic Council meeting held on July 26, 2019. As advised by the Council an in-depth analysis of the NAAC report is being carried out to find the gaps so that corrective measures for the same could be adopted. The Chairperson informed that regular meetings of the Internal Quality

Assessment Cell (IQAC) was being held to monitor the progress on various NAAC related issues.

The Board noted the matter.

- ITEM No.2(f). Update on Hyderabad Campus. The Registrar informed that since the NAAC had finally retained a score below 3.26, the University had become ineligible to open Off Campus Centre as per the Deemed university rules. He informed that the Vice Chancellor had requested MHRD and UGC to review their decisions and sought clarification in light of lowered NAAC score. He stated that on this, the UGC had advised to pursue the proposal under existing Deemed University Regulation (2019) and approach MHRD. He intimated that the VC accordingly met Shri R Subrahmanyam, Secretary, Higher Education, MHRD on 26 June 2019 and had requested him to reconsider the proposal under earlier regulations. The Registrar stated that consultation with Trustees were held by the Vice Chancellor on 05 Aug 2019 and subsequently the Trustees along with the VC visited the Hyderabad Campus on 13 Aug 2019 and a report on the visit had been shared with the Chancellor. The following plans had been suggested after the visit: -
 - (i) Payment for pending bills for completed works would be released for commencing the work and ensure timely completion of the project.
 - (ii) On release of payment, the civil work would be completed by mid-October 2019. It would take another 2-3 months to get completion and occupancy certificate so the campus could be ready for operation by January 2020.
 - (iii) Director Hyderabad Campus had been advised to make an estimate of cost overrun due to delay in implementation.
 - (iv) Till date TERI SAS had been bearing the operation cost of Hyderabad related to salary of staff, maintenance and security of the campus. A business plan in collaboration with Hyderabad team was therefore being worked out to generate funds for making the campus self-reliant. Some of the proposals which were being considered are:
 - o <u>Instituting Management Development Programmes (MDPs)</u>: Different models of MDPs have been discussed and it was agreed to identify the best model and topic which would be suitable for Hyderabad. It was suggested that MDPs on business sustainability, climate change and related issues would be explored.
 - o Accessing research grants: A proposal has been submitted to M/s Corteva, a corporate body for a research cum action programme on water security for Hyderabad. Similarly, a research proposal has been sent to Azim Premji Foundation for urban resilience issue.
 - o <u>Certificate programme for working professionals</u>: 6 months certificate programmes on sustainability issues could be launched for working professionals with an option for weekend classes. It might attract the corporate professionals who want to make a career on sustainability issues. Faculties in Delhi and Hyderabad including professionals from TERI could be utilised as faculties for such programmes

- o Option for state university and undergraduate prorgamme: The feasibility of state university route could be explored. This would require the approval of the state legislature and help launching undergraduate programmes thus helping in generating the operating costs because of larger student mass.
- o <u>Outreach and ecotourism</u>: The facility at Hyderabad could be used for outreach and ecotourism programmes to target young students, corporate leaders and NGOs. These programmes could be designed in consultation with TERI which has similar programme.

The Board noted the matter. The VC informed that a special agenda on Hyderabad campus would be planned in the next BoM to cover all aspects of the project.

ITEM No.2 (g). MoU signed with Deakin University, Australia. The Registrar intimated that an MoU had been signed between TERI SAS and Deakin University, Australia, on June 30, 2019. He stated that under the MoU, the two parties had agreed to continue to explore establishing collaborative relationship in research and development projects, joint PhD supervision, joint publications, training in post graduate research and industrial research, etc.

The Board noted the matter.

OTHER AGENDA POINTS

ITEM NO 3. To record approval of BoM nominee for Search cum Selection Committee.

The Registrar informed that, since the post of whole time Vice Chancellor of the University had fallen vacant with effect from 10 July 2019 the process of selecting a suitable candidate to the position has been initiated on the directions of the Chancellor. He apprised the members that according to the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations 2019 and the rules of the University, the Vice Chancellor of the University is required to be appointed by the Chancellor from a panel of three names suggested by a Search-cum-Selection committee and the composition of the committee as prescribed in the rules is as follows: -

- a) A nominee of the Chancellor, who shall be a reputed academician as the Chairperson of the Committee.
- b) A nominee of the Chairman, University Grants Commission.
- c) An academician, with not less than 10-year service as Professor, nominated by the Board of Management.

He informed that on the concurrence of the Chancellor, an internal committee consisting of the five senior most Professors recommended four names and the suggested panel of names were circulated to BoM members on 18th July 19. The process of identification of Board nominee for the Search cum Selection committee was concluded on 10th Aug 2019 and the selected name has been conveyed to the members on 16 Aug 2019 through a confidential circular.

The Board noted the matter.

- ITEM NO 4. To record approval of Resolution on nomination of Finance Committee member. The Registrar informed that the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations 2019 stipulated two nominees (one of whom shall be a Board member) of the Board of Management for the Finance Committee of TERI SAS (Section 10.11.3 (A) (iv)). He stated that a proposal to nominate the BoM nominee for the vacant member position was circulated on 9th Aug 2019 and the Board had resolved to approve the following
- **TS/BM/33.4.1.** The Board resolved to approve the name of Prof Shaleen Singhal as the Board nominee for the Finance Committee of TERI School of Advanced Studies for a period of three years wef 17th Aug 2019.
- ITEM NO 5. To approve withdrawal of authority for operating all the Bank Accounts of TERI SAS and other financial/legal documents. The registrar informed that consequent to Dr Leena Srivastava relinquishing her post, as Vice Chancellor, it is proposed that the authority given by the BoM to her to operate accounts of TERI SAS and sign other records to be withdrawn forthwith.
- **TS/BM/33.5.1.** The Board resolved to approve that authority given to Dr Leena Srivastava for operating accounts and sign documents on behalf of TERI SAS be withdrawn.
- ITEM NO 6. To approve Vice Chancellor for operating all the Bank Accounts of TERI SAS and signing other financial/legal documents. Consequent to Dr Manipadma Datta assuming the duties of the Vice chancellor(acting), it is proposed that he be authorised to execute for and on behalf of the University agreement, demand promissory note, letter of continuity, request letters and any other agreement, deeds, financial documents and writings as may be required by banks/financial or other institutions
- **TS/BM/33.6.1.** The Board resolved that Dr Manipadma Datta, Vice Chancellor (acting) is authorised to enter into agreement, sign documents and authenticate records on behalf of the Institution Deemed to be University and execute for and on behalf of the University any demand promissory note, letter of continuity, request letters and any other agreement, deeds, documents and writings as may be required by banks/financial institutions and also is authorised to create such security as may be required for any specific purpose.
- ITEM NO 7. To report a case of Grievance Redressal: The Registrar informed the Board that on the recommendation of the Chancellor, a sub-committee of the Board of Management was set up to look into an appeal against the decision of the Board vide its resolution TS/BM/31.5.1 dated 20 Feb 2019. The sub-committee had submitted its recommendations after interacting with the complainant to the Chancellor and the same has been concurred by the Chancellor. He stated that the subcommittee is of the unanimous view that the present case does not merit for reconsideration. He presented the report to the Board.
- **TS/BM/33.7.1.** The Board resolved to accept the report of the subcommittee and advised that the complainant be communicated that " *Due process and fair play has been followed by the University in fixation of new CTC of employees in Nov 2017 and it was applied uniformly across the board"*

- ITEM NO.8. To cause amendment to resolution passed at 32nd BoM. The Registrar intimated that the Chancellor while perusing the resolution passed by the BoM vide TS/BM/32.10.1. regarding approval of policy on Establishing and Operationalising Research Centres at TERI SAS has appreciated that efforts are being put in to promote research in TERI SAS. With respect to the recruitment of research personnel, the Chancellor has advised that, since research personnel are likely to be provided the same status, salary and perks as faculty, their selection procedure should be similar to that of faculty selection. Accordingly, the following amendments are placed before the Board for perusal and approval. The Board reviewed the amendment.
- **TS/BM/33.8.1.** The Board resolved to approve that the contents at Para 6.0 (e) at Enclosure 8 of BoM resolution TS/BM/32/10.1 dated 06 June 2019 shall be replaced with 'selection committees will be as per UGC norms for equivalent faculty positions'
- ITEM NO.9. To revise all relevant rules in the Compendium as per UGC Rules and Regulations. The Registrar informed that as resolved by the Board in its resolution TS/BM/32.19.1. dated 06 June 2019, the signed affidavit with respect to MoA has been submitted on 25 July 2019. As required under Para 10.1(s) of the MOA the University is required to adhere to rules /regulations/direction issued by the UGC and other relevant statutory bodies from time to time. (Academic) mentioned that committees have been formed by the VC to look into the issue and as such many processes followed by the University are more stringent than the UGC norms. The VC informed that the UGC norms are used in the University selectively and there are rules which are not in accordance with the UGC norms hence the Board may examine the issue as there are legal implications as well as statutory compliance issues with the UGC. He requested the Board to consider permitting to amend compendium norms in line with the UGC regulations/directions for all purposes other than rules having where financial implications as we have already committed to UGC to follow their norms under oath. He mentioned that it is true that committees have ben constituted to look into specific aspects like re-designation to bring the existing rules in line with UGC norms. Members opined that the University has been selective in adopting the UGC rules however it should strictly follow UGC norms.
- **TS/BM/33.9.1.** The Board resolved to approve that TERI SAS Compendium of Rules be revised periodically to make it wholly compatible with the latest UGC regulations and notifications.
- ITEM NO.10. To approve the award of Degrees and other academic titles based on Final Examination. The Registrar presented the list of qualified students to the Board.
- **TS/BM/33.10.1.** The Board resolved to approve grant of Degrees/Diploma by TERI School of Advanced Studies to the students as per details placed at **Enclosure 1**
- **ITEM NO.11. To approve award of Doctor of Philosophy, honoris causa.** The Registrar presented a proposal for approval of the Board for Honoris causa.
- **TS/BM/33.11.1** The Board recommended that an internal committee may be constituted to suggest the name to the Board.

- ITEM NO 12: To consider and approve audited statement of accounts of the financial year 2018-19. The Dy Finance and Project Management Officer presented the Audited accounts for the financial year 2018-19.
- **TS/BM/33.12.1** The Board resolved to approve the audited accounts for financial year 2018-19 placed at enclosure 2.
- **ITEM NO 13:To consider and approve the financial estimates for the financial year 2019- 20.** The Dy Finance and Project Management Officer presented that incomes estimate and recurring and non-recurring expenditure estimates for the period 1 April 2019 31 March 2020.
- **TS/BM/33.13.1** The Board resolved to approve the estimates for the financial year 2019-20 placed at Enclosure 3.
- ITEM NO.14: To report income and cash crisis appraisal. The Chair shared that the research funding is shrinking, and salary and other expenses were increasing. He intimated that alternative sources of revenue need to be explored to overcome the cash crunch. He intimated that there was an annual operating deficit of INR 5 crores in income and liquidity. Members suggested that measures need to be taken to cut expenditure and increase income through different programmes and scale up other activities and tap CSR funds. The Chair informed that as far as Hyderabad Campus and conduct of Climate Jamboree was concerned, the University had overspent and without any tangible takeaway hence the Finance Committee had recommended a special audit on these two activities. He further apprised the members that the auditor had recommended that general strategic and management audit of the organization could be carried out by an independent agency because it was continuously accumulating deficit.

The Board noted the matter.

ITEM No.15: To report the decisions taken by the Chairperson on behalf of the Board of Management. Dean (Academic) pointed out certain aspects of the process followed in respect of re-designation of a case. The Registrar presented the chronology of events in that case and the Chair clarified that due diligence had been carried out in dealing with the redesignation. The detailed discussion is placed at Enclosure 4. The Board reviewed the case and suggested that to avoid such contentious issues the appointment letters of all cases presented to Board be issued after approval of the Board.
