2018-2019 FNIEAS – Employer's comments

Dr. Nandan Nawn joined the TERI School of Advanced Studies (then known as TERI University), New Delhi, India on 26th May, 2014 as an Associate Professor.

Soon after joining he undertook three responsibilities pertaining to MSc Economics (with a specialisation in Environment and Resource Economics) programme: Master's Thesis Coordinator, Placement Coordinator and Internship Coordinator. He continued with the first responsibility for another year (2015-16) and with a gap of one year, again (2017-18).

During his tenure the structure of the Master's Thesis attained a more concrete shape besides acquiring a more professional look. It ranged from the submission of motivation by the students to him, guidance received by the students from him towards preparation of abstracts and allocation of supervisors, to scheduling of presentations and involvement of external faculty members in supervision. Contents of the theses improved as well, for his specialisation in economics of the environment. He had initiated making all the submissions connected with Master's Thesis to undergo a compulsory electronic check for similarities in expression (Turnitin) with the report shared with the concerned student and evaluator(s) -- later the scope of such a scrutiny was expanded to all the courses in the MSc Economics programme. Now it is mandatory for all courses across all programmes in the University. For the last three consecutive years, MSc Economics students have recorded a cent percent placement--one reason being the analytical skills imbibed in the students undergoing the rigour of Masters' Thesis. Much of the credit goes to Nandan for the meticulous design and its scrupulous implementation.

Along with these responsibilities, he took the responsibility of teaching no less than 14 credits every academic year, which translates to four courses. He has always received excellent feedback from the students--his 'ranking' will be one among the top. He has also served as a member of the Academic Council of the University, Member and then Convenor of Library Committee, member of Internal Quality Assurance Cell and Planning and Monitoring Board.

Since 1st June, 2017 he has assumed the responsibilities of Head of Department of Policy Studies. He has taken a number of initiatives, including organising a research colloquium for the doctoral students of the department to present their ongoing research and receive feedback, re-constitution of the Board of Studies of the department to involve experts from a variety of fields who can contribute to all the five programmes offered by the department, rationalising the process of supervision of doctoral students, regularity in holding meetings of all the committees under the department, circulation of Minutes of all such meetings, distribution of responsibilities to make everyone feel involved, among others.

His participation in the 2018-2019 Fulbright-Nehru International Education Administrators Seminar (IEAS) will be greatly beneficial not just to him or Department of Policy Studies but also the institution. TERI School of Advanced Studies, since its inception has been greatly benefitted by the multiple collaborations with a number of US educational institutions, for both teaching and research. The network that Dr. Nawn will be able to forge through his participation in this programme will greatly help in sustaining such efforts.

The University will be happy to grant on-duty leave for the duration of fellowship.



OUTCOME LINKED AWARDS/PERFORMANCE LINKED REWARDS(OLA/PLR): 2017

1. The system of outcome-linked awards (OLA) at the TERI University is being instituted to recognise outstanding contributions of faculty members and to signal the direction in which the University would like its faculty to strive. At the same time, the University would also like to reward exceptional achievements of faculty members, be they in terms of teaching, research or other contributions. In rewarding these exceptional achievements, the University would henceforth bear in mind that all faculty members in the University are expected to be of a high quality. As such, these rewards would only be given for achievements beyond normal expectations.
2. Outcome linked award (OLA) and Performance Linked Rewards (PLR) will be applicable to faculty members employed by and drawing salary from the University who are on the rolls on 30 June of each year and have completed at least 6 months of service at the University. This will include those on deputation to the University.
3. For purposes of determining the OLA/PLR, the performance of the preceding year (year ending 30 June) will be considered.
4. The decision on OLA/PLR will be made in end July/early August each year.
5. OLA will be as follows:
 - (a) Rs 5 lakhs for each approved patent where the affiliation is to the TERI University
 - (b) Rs 50,000/- for each publication in category A journals and a personal academic expenditure budget of Rs 25,000 to be spent by the awardee on any academic activity within a period of 2 year from the date of the grant (First Author)
 - (c) “Faculty of the Year” awards of Rs 30,000/- each, based on all-round performance assessed on students’ feedback, pedagogical innovations, number of on-track Ph.D students, events organised, conferences attended with substantial roles, positive attitude and team spirit. Faculty members selected for this award would also be recognised on the University’s website and at a suitable place on the premises.

In addition, faculty members will be rewarded

- (d) Rs25,000/- for a minimum of 2 publications in non-category A international peer reviewed journals or their equivalent (recognised by first author; half weightage given to supervisor when first author is a student)

(e) Rs 3,500/- per hour of recorded lectures (approved and with quality control)for online courses

6. In order to encourage interdisciplinary and collaborative research, the award/reward for publications would be increased by 10% for each additional author in the case of co-authored publications. The award/reward amounts would normally be equally shared between authors unless they mutually decide otherwise.
7. The award for publications would be applicable only to publications from the faculty member's own research and not from publications based on students work. However, the reward for publication in international peer reviewed journals would apply to the main supervisor for publications related to the work of PhD/Masters students as well.
8. The 'Faculty of the Year' award may be given to more than one faculty member each year. However, a faculty member can earn this award only once in 2 years. Faculty members would need to indicate in their appraisal forms if they would like to be considered for this award. A jury comprising the VC and 2 members of the academic council would evaluate candidates. This award would be bestowed on Teachers Day.
9. These awards/rewards will be applicable from academic year 2016-17 itself.



ROLE RELATED REWARDS(RRR): 2017

1. Role related rewards(RRR) are being instituted to recognise efforts put in by faculty members in academic administrative functions. Whilst appointments to major roles in the University are, by themselves, recognition of the capabilities of an individual to lead and contribute to the growth of the University, RRRs will be an acknowledgement of the work and efforts put in while in that role.
2. RRRs will be applicable to faculty members assigned to and working in the respective roles as on 30 June of each year and who have completed at least 6 months in that role. This will include those on deputation to the University.
3. For purposes of determining the RRR, the performance of the preceding year (year ending 30 June) will be considered.
4. The decision on RRR will be made in end July/early August each year.
5. RRR will be as follows:
 - (a) Rs1 lakh for the position of Dean.
 - (b) Heads of Department – Maximum of Rs60,000/- (The reward would be based on performance judged through the Department's research strategy and quality, quality of programme delivery (including time adherence), and optimal resource deployment).
 - (c) Programme coordinators – Maximum of Rs 30,000/- (The reward would be based on student feedback, quality and timeliness, and cost optimisation.)
6. These rewards will be applicable from academic year 2016-17 itself. Faculty will not be eligible for 2 RRRs
