Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.	<p>In pursuance of the relevant Government Directives, TERI School of Advanced Studies took the following steps for the safety and wellbeing of all, while ensuring minimum disruption to the teaching-learning processes:</p> <p>1. All regular classes were suspended w.e.f. 13 March 2020 and online classes were launched w.e.f. 16 March 2020. The online mode has ensured near-zero loss of teaching days. The MS Teams platform was widely used for all academic activities and official meetings. Feedbacks on online lectures were obtained in late March-April 2020 (see, A report on the first round of feedback on online classes from students, A report on the second round of feedback on online classes and examinations from students, and A report of a survey conducted among faculty members on online teaching and evaluation). The reports were shared with the concerned stakeholders to take appropriate actions. Regular feedback obtained from the students in the normal course at the end of the semester did not mention any adverse comments on the online teaching-learning processes as such, except internet bandwidth at the students' end and access to electronic devices to join the class.</p> <p>2. Academic and Admission calendars were revised as per UGC/AICTE directives and academic as well as examinations activities were conducted through revised processes. The revised processes so adopted were informed to the Academic Council at its 48th meeting held on 16 July 2020. The results for January-June 2020 semester were declared on 31st July, 2020. The classes in the A.Y. 2020-21 started on 4th August for continuing students, and it was 1st September for the newly admitted students. Examinations of this semester were completed by 15 January 2021, and results were declared subsequently. Classes has started since 27 January 2021.</p> <p>3. Convocation took place in the online mode on 8th December 2020, where XX students received degree. Following the institutions, majority of the students have collected the physical copy of their degree.</p> <p>4. Institutionalized set-up for providing individual mentorship to students through Mentor-Mentee framework at TERI SAS was extensively used to address various issues. As directed by UGC, Grievance Cells on COVID-19 was established w.e.f. 18 May 2020. Periodic advisories on physical well-being and mental health were issued to students and faculty based on Mon/Fri and UGC/AICTE directives/instructions. The telephone number of the Counsellor was shared with students for any immediate consultations. WhatsApp groups of staff were used to circulate vital information under administration of senior colleagues to streamline all online teaching activities.</p> <p>5. The ICT initiatives of MHRD and UGC towards learning and development including several online resource materials were shared with students. As directed by AICTE a report on the study in pandemic response was carried out by a faculty member and students in four villages in Gurugram District of Haryana. The report has been shared with AICTE. Also, the Institute Innovation Cell (IIC) actively monitored the MHRD's Innovation Cell driven activities. Students were encouraged to participate in the "Bharat Padhe Online" campaign. One faculty member submitted an entry in response.</p>
