JAIPUR, DRAVYAVATI RIVER PROJECT, TILONIYA AND SARISKA

## Study Trip – Learning Objectives

1. Understanding the importance of heritage in cities and measures taken for its conservation, through a heritage walk in wall city : Amber settlement.
2. Experience a large-scale urban project through Dravyavati River Project. The project deals with 47-kilometre-long “Amaanishah Naala” which is the cause of major health concerns in Jaipur. The plan is to build Sewage Treatment Plants (STPs), develop large scale plantation and develop the riverside stretch as a city level green space.
3. Experience the change in rural livelihoods through a rural sustainability school called the “Barefoot College”. It intends to create solutions that work at the village level with a combination of traditional skills and experiential learning.
4. Understanding issues of conservation of natural resources and wildlife in Sariska National Park.

### STUDY TRIP REPORT (FOLLOWS)

Students are supposed to prepare short reports, essays, photo-documentation or video documentations which should be based on the observations during site visits and interaction with resource persons and stakeholders.

Some suggested questions to explore are following,

1. Is heritage important? How conservation efforts conflict with increase in tourism and need for modern buildings? How can we make heritage conservation sustainable?
2. What are the sustainability challenges and impacts of a large scale urban project? How can we professionals contribute to assess and overcome these challenges?
3. What do we learn from the Barefoot movement? How can we replicate this model elsewhere in the country? What are the possible challenges in its replication?
4. Could tourism and environment protection go hand in hand? Is there anything unique in Sariska which could be an answer to this question?

#### **Maintain Discipline: in Bus. On Ground and at Destinations**

**Don't wander off.** Listen carefully to instructions and be with the group or your assigned partner. Don't ever wander off on your own, or your trip could end badly.

**Be courteous to Resource Persons / Instructors / Facilitators.** Don't be disruptive.

**Respect nature.** Some field trips will take you into contact with animals or plants. Be mindful of potential dangers for your own safety.

**Keep an eye on the clock.** you should keep an eye on the time. You don't want to miss lunch, and you surely don't want to be left behind.

#### Have a good time

**Arrive in plenty of time to get on the bus.** You don't want to miss the fun day because you ran into heavy traffic and could not make it. Plan ahead and leave early.

**Carry your SLR or a good compact camera to capture the moment and the memories**

**Eat and drink in designated places.**

**Dress for hot and cold. Bring comfort items for the ride.** If it's a warm day, it could be really cold inside a building. If it's cold outside, it could be steamy inside! Try

to dress in layers so you can add and subtract as necessary. If you are facing a long bus ride, ask if you can bring a pillow or small cover for comfort.

**Don't litter.** You can be banned from some locations for this. Don't be sent back to the bus!

**Guidelines for Field Trips - :**

As students and staff are representing our University, a certain kind of decorum should be maintained during the field trip

Students are supposed to adhere to the following guidelines while on field trips:

1. Students are required to necessarily fill and submit the indemnity form before undertaking the study tour. Indemnity form will be shared with the students by respective faculty members who would be accompanying them on the trip.
2. Students are required to carry the TERI SAS identity card (ID) and at least one other government ID. All foreign nationals must carry their passport at all times.
3. Students are expected to participate in all the activities planned during the study tour. They must keep a field notebook and take notes while making observations and interacting with resource persons as well as other stakeholders.
4. Punctuality is essential for smoothly conducting a study tour in large groups. The time is limited and one person's delay could waste a lot of time for others. Please be on time on all days and make the best use of available time.
5. All students must take appropriate safety measures during the trip and should not indulge in any irresponsible behaviour.
6. Students are expected to maintain best of behaviour and a sense of respect for all the resource persons. They should respect the culture norms/customs specially in the rural areas.
7. Students are advised to dress comfortably and footwear appropriate for long walks.
8. Students are strictly prohibited from carrying or consuming alcohol, drugs and tobacco products like cigarettes. If any student is found to be carrying or consuming a prohibited substance, the matter would be immediately taken with the authorities.
9. If any student has any dietary or medical requirement, kindly inform well in advance. Students are advised to carry medicines in case of specific ailments.
10. The responsibility of taking care of personal belongings rests with the individual.
11. Please carry all the stuff you would need, including medicines, torch, mosquito repellents and emergency food like biscuits, chips, etc.
12. All students are supposed to reach back the hotel in the evening at the specified time as informed to them in advance by accompanying faculty coordinator
13. Students will share their mobile number in advance with faculty coordinator for better coordination. It will be of help to create a WhatsApp group amongst all students and faculty coordinators for better coordination during the trip
14. Faculty coordinators are advised to make a team of two student coordinators, preferable a boy and a girl for helping in coordination of various activities during the field trip.
