Agenda no 1. Confirmation of the minutes of the last meeting held on 27 October 2018

Agenda no 2. Recommendation to the Academic Council the outline of following new courses

2a. Art for Sustainability

Following changes were suggested;

- To incorporate book reviews on Indian context(s)
- Field visits shall be part of this course
- Students may be given field exposures to places of importance historically and artistically such as Jamali Kamali, National Museum etc.
- Suggestions were made that instead of suggesting a book, the instructor should instruct students about the principle of choosing a book
- Readings should include 'Babbarnama', Works of 'Gopinath Munde', books like
 The Fissured Land
- It was suggested that Dr Suvendu Ghosh may be invited to review the course, given his expertise in this domain
- Specific suggestions were made regarding module 3 and module 4 to change the title of these modules
- Lecture-Tutorial distribution has to be reconsidered
- Sustainability of graphic designs may be considered as part of this course

2b. Development Economics

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2c. Growth Economics

Following changes were suggested for the above two courses;

- Module 3 and module 4 (in Development Economics) are overlapping- so needs to be given attention
- Concept of 'Capital' has to be made broad based instead of limiting it to 'Financial Capital' in the Development Economics course
- It was suggested that the entire Development Economics course may be restructured into three modules such as 1) Measurement Issues, 2) Capitals and Constraints and 3) Interventions and Outcomes
- Flow in both the courses is missing hence, necessitates redesigning
- It was also suggested that both courses are too discreet in the current form. Each module may require further elaboration
- Data and political economy are cross cutting issues, hence should be part of each of the modules rather than putting them in separate modules

2d. Application of Quantitative Data Analysis in Development Practice Following changes were suggested;

- Data base shall be expanded and broadened by incorporating other data sets such as Socio-economic Census data
- Pre-requisite for taking this course should be clearly mentioned
- The L-T-P composition requires redesigning
- More readings may be included in the reference/ reading list

Agenda no 3. Recommendation to the Academic Council the outline of following revised courses

3a. Introduction to Mathematical Methods in Economics

Following changes were suggested;

- On the home assignment front, it was suggested to review the timeline set for completing the home assignments

3b. Micro-economics

Following changes were suggested;

- Same as above on the question on 'home assignment'

3c. Environment and Economic Development

Following changes were suggested;

- The course looks too ambitious- may be shortened
- To relook at how this course gets tuned with other courses in particular with the 'Development Economics' course

3d. Probability and Statistics

- No comments made

3e. Trade, Development and Environment

Following changes were suggested;

- Section 3.4 and Section 4.4 are overlapping-requires attention
- Cases such as solar panel case, shrimp-turtle case, Tuna-Dolphin Case, US gasoline case may be included
- Peep into multi-lateral agreements rather than RTAs

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- Learning outcomes need to be clearly defined
- There should be clarity in terms of whether social clauses such as labour standards be included in the trade
- Trade related global value chains issues may be incorporated
- Issues related to 'trade leading to underdevelopment' may be incorporated
