<p>This course is designed to understand and examine the various urban development policies and programmes that have been implemented in the country to: (i) promote a balanced urban development in the country, (ii) create conducive environment for the development of required infrastructure and services, and (iii) assist in efficient management of urban areas. It will present a historical perspective of the policies and programmes as evolved since independence. The course will provide a critical analysis of the policies and programmes and their evaluations.</p> <p>The course is structured under three modules. Module 1 provides an overview of urban development policies and programmes. Module 2 covers the critical analysis and evaluation of implementation of select urban development policies and programmes. Module 3 is devoted to the on-going policies and programmes.</p>
