## **Work Experience**

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### ***1.1 Faculty at the level of Asst. Prof. (Sept. 2017-April 2018)***

Taught the following subjects through two semesters: ‘Theoretical Debates in Humanities & Social Sciences’, ‘Introduction to Humanities & Social Sciences’ & ‘Art of Communication’ to BA students of Cluster Innovation Centre, University of Delhi, New Delhi. Mentored two social intervention-based projects titled:

1. *‘Digital Literacy during the time of Demonetisation: A case study of e-rickshaw drivers of Delhi’*. This project involved collecting relevant data from 110 e-rickshaw drivers in & around Delhi about impact of demonetisation on their livelihood. The project team connected 70 e-rickshaw drivers with their respective banks through mobile, and/or were taught how to use mobile apps to enhance their digital literacy.

2. *‘Exploring Dimensions of Racial Discrimination experienced by Northeast students living in Delhi’*. Data from 75 Northeast and non-Northeast students was collected and analysed for dimensions of discrimination. As social intervention, coping strategies were shared through a sensitisation and training workshop at CIC, DU.
